What have the children been learning?

Nursery/Pre-school

The children have been enjoying using snow dough to create snowmen, chalk to decorate our gingerbread house and craft supplies to create and decorate our very own Christmas tree.

Reception

This week the children performed their Christmas nativity. They were so brave saying their words on the stage and sang their songs beautifully with all of their actions. The children have created a 'five frame' of ingredients and have scooped, sprinkled and poured to make a bag of reindeer food for Christmas Eve! They have been involved in lots of Christmas based activities in the provision and enjoyed a fun filled party. It's been a great way to end a busy term.

Year One

In Writing, we wrote letters to Father Christmas, carefully thinking about what we would like to ask for and practising our letter-writing skills.

In Maths, we completed our topic on shapes, where we compared and named different 2D and 3D shapes. We also enjoyed some Christmas-themed maths investigations, including *dressing* the elves, which helped us apply our maths skills in a fun and festive way.

We also enjoyed lots of Christmas crafts, such as making decorations and creating our own Christmas cards for special people in our lives.

Across our wider curriculum, we completed our topics in each subject. We learned about local history, explored different artists who use line in their artwork, and in science we learned about animals and their needs. Perhaps you could ask your child to tell you a fact they have learned about animals!

To finish off our festive fortnight, we had a fantastic time at our Christmas party, playing games, dancing, and enjoying some delicious party food together.

Year Two

We have had a very busy time in Year 2! In English we have been doing lots of Christmas themed writing, including Winter acrostic poems, expanded noun phrases to describe Christmassy pictures and instructions for Christmas baking! In Maths we have worked hard on 2D and 3D shapes. We finished our Ferris Wheel designs in DT and they looked brilliant! We have all had such a fantastic term and look forward to more learning in the New Year!

Clover, Iris and Lily

In Iris and Clover class we have been telling sensory stories linked to journeys. Iris class have enjoyed the story 'Mrs Armitage on Wheels', where they made the sound of the bicycle bell and used water and soap to wash the bike. Clover class enjoyed 'The Lion on the Bus' story where different wild animals travel on the bus. The children enjoyed playing with the toy bus as well as painting a red bus and exploring wild animals in gloop during messy play. In Lily class they have enjoyed the story of the 'Rainbow Fish' about friendship. They have also explored different sensory experiences with water beads and wet sand.
