## What have the children been learning?

### **Nursery/Pre-school**

This week Nursery and Preschool have been reading the book 'The Naughty Bus'. Some of the activities they have been doing have been based around the story and journeys. Children have been using the junk modelling to make their own buses. Outside we have had enjoyed riding the bikes, scooters and cars.

### Reception

Reception have been very excited this week investigating the missing gingerbread man! We have also been on shapes hunts, explored representing numbers to 5 and enjoyed the colder weather outside!

#### **Year One**

This week in Year One, the children have been busy writing their own sets of instructions inspired by How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth. They created imaginative guides on caring for all sorts of animals, including fierce snakes, cute rabbits and fast cheetahs. Through this work, they learnt how to use titles, sub-headings and numbered steps to organise their writing clearly.

In maths, we have been practising subtraction using a range of helpful resources such as number lines and tens frames. The children have been developing their confidence in working out answers in different ways.

During DT, the children designed and built their own basketball hoops using paper straws and pipe cleaners. They carefully considered how to make a wide, stable base and even used playdough as a counterbalance to stop their hoops from toppling over.

In science, we explored how animals can be grouped by what they eat. The children learnt that carnivores eat meat, herbivores eat plants and omnivores eat both.

#### **Year Two**

In Year 2, we have been learning the story of Cinderella. We have completed a class innovation this week, changing some of the characters and the setting! In Maths, we have been practising mastering our addition and subtraction skills. We have been crossing a 10, so learning to exchange. In Science, we drew rainforest and desert habitats and the different animals and plants that live there. We have also been busy this week, practising singing and signing some Christmas songs!

### Clover, Iris and Lily

In Iris and Clover class we have been telling sensory stories linked to journeys. Iris class have enjoyed the story 'Mrs Armitage on Wheels', where they made the sound of the bicycle bell and used water and soap to wash the bike. Clover class enjoyed 'The Lion on the Bus' story where different wild animals travel on the bus. The children enjoyed playing with the toy bus as well as painting a red bus and exploring wild animals in gloop during messy play. In Lily class they have enjoyed the story of the 'Rainbow Fish' about friendship. They have also explored different sensory experiences with water beads and wet sand.
